

Application

Evaluations

• Candidates are responsible for ensuring evaluators submit their evaluations

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- List of SEVEN evaluators will be submitted with application
 - Chapter Advisor (multiple advisors may submit individually or together)
 - School Administrator or College Faculty Member
 - Non-Agriculture Teacher
 - Four Current FFA Members (at least one from your chapter and at least one from another chapter)

Examination and Interviews

Examination

- Written essay questions related to agriculture, education, and FFA
- Provided to candidate 3 weeks before convention
- Due Friday before convention: May 26th, 2023

Interviews

- Behavioral Based Interviews
- Full committee interviews and One-onone interviews

Prepared Speech & Extemporaneous Remarks

Prepared Speech

- Presented on stage at the first convention session
- Evaluated by delegates and the nominating committee
- Maximum length: 2.5 minutes
- No props, handheld microphone



Extemporaneous Remarks

• Completed via Zoom before convention

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- Candidate Introduction
- Greeting or thank you to specific audience
- FFA or agriculture education experience
- Current topic or issue in agriculture, agricultural education, or FFA.
- Example prompts available in the State Officer Selection Process Handbook
- Preparation time: 5-10 minutes
- Speaking time: 1.5 3 minutes

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Stakeholder Conversations & Group Activity

Stakeholder Conversations

- Three, 5-minute CONVERSATIONS
- Candidates represent themselves and stakeholder will represent their actual role in the industry
- Candidates will be given information on who the stakeholder is and what they wish to discuss before entering the room

Group Activity

- Groups of 3-5 candidates
- Provided a topic or scenario to address
- May be completed virtually or in-person
- Will be observed by the committee

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How To Make Your Experience Successful



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General Preparation Tips

Read	Read the Handbook
Seriously	(Read the whole Handbook)
Open Mind	Approach the process with an open mind and a willingness to learn
News	Review news resources to learn more about agriculture and education
Serve	Develop a personal understanding of your desire to serve the organization
Skills	Become familiar with your skills, abilities, and traits
Mentor	Seek out a coach or mentor
